The band history, lasting more than 25 years, is divided in two periods corresponding to two geographical areas :

-the first was in Puglia (a southern region of Italy) where it was founded in 1982 as "Black Cat Bones" by Gennaro Carrillo and by Enzo "Bob Rock" Palumbo (this period finished in 1989);

-the second one started in 1992, when the band was refounded in Milan (the biggest city of the north-Italy), this time again by Gennaro Carrillo and by Gianni Di Ruvo (already guitar player of the band during 1986), both moved to Milan for job, with a slightly different name "Black Cat Bone blues band".
