Howlin' Wolf's second album brings together some of the blues great's best singles from the late '50s and early '60s. Those tracks afforded classic status are many, including "Spoonful," "The Red Rooster," "Wang Dang Doodle," "Back Door Man," "Shake for Me," and "Who's Been Talking?"
